The study underscores gastronomy's dual role as a cultural expression and an economic driver, contributing to local development, community engagement, and sustainability. The emphasis on local produce and sustainable practices highlights the region's commitment to environmental conservation and community empowerment. Integrating gastronomy more deeply into tourism strategies can significantly boost Iloilo Province's appeal and competitiveness as a tourist destination, setting a model for other regions.
